Dear Parents:



Juniors, Did You Know...

That the SAT is the nation's most widely used college admissions test, accepted by the majority of colleges and universities in this country and used to determine your ability to be successful in post-secondary level course work?

First developed in 1901, the SAT is a measure of your skills at critical thinking and logical reasoning, not a just a test of academic knowledge. There are three sections, reading comprehension, math and writing. Scores are scaled, based on the performance of other students taking the same test during the same period. A perfect score for all three sections is 2400, but most students score between 1400 and 1650. The test can be taken multiple times, if desired, and you can choose to report only the highest scores on any exam when applying to colleges.

Current Junior students should plan to take the exam during the spring semester or, at the latest, during the fall of Senior year so that scores will be ready when working on college applications.

Exams for the remainder of the 2011/2012 school year are scheduled for January 28, March 10, May 5 and June 2. Check out the website at www.collegeboard.com for information on registrations and fees.

Please keep in mind that requests for teacher changes or to drop AP level courses require approval from an administrator and will not be considered without a detailed explanation, in writing, from a parent.

Course Selections for 2012/2013 Start in February

Students should choose wisely and parents are encouraged to review their child's choices before signing the form. Counselors will be meeting with each student to discuss classes and create a schedule. 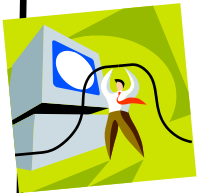

What is it?

Where and when is it?

How do I register?
